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over the last three decades a number of reforms have taken place in european social policy with an impact on the opportunities for persons with disabilities to be full and active members of society the policy reforms have aimed to change the balance between citizens rights and duties and the opportunities to enjoy choice and autonomy live in the community and participate in political decision making processes of importance for one s life how do the reforms influence the opportunities to exercise active citizenship this volume presents the findings from the first cross national comparison of how persons with disabilities reflexively make their way through the world pursuing their own interests and values the volume considers how their experiences views and aspirations regarding participation vary across europe based on retrospective life course interviews the volume examines the scope for agency on the part of persons with disabilities i e the extent to which men and women with disabilities are able to make choices and pursue lives they have reasons to value drawing on structuration theory and the capability approach the volume investigates the opportunities for exercising active citizenship among men and women in nine european countries the volume identifies the policy implications of a process oriented and multi dimensional approach to active citizenship in european disability policy it will appeal to

policymakers and policy officials as well as to researchers and students of disability studies comparative social policy international disability law and qualitative research methods

bangladesh is one of the most poverty stricken developing countries in south east asia the country faces immense problems of persons with disabilities but the main problems are not yet prioritized according to the world bank estimates about 15 of the population in bangladesh consists of persons with disabilities and the number is increasing day by day it is evident that persons with disabilities are more likely to experience economic and social disadvantages than those without disability in bangladesh this book illustrates the livelihood pattern of those persons with disabilities living in dhaka city

the book took shape from the work i undertook as part of my doctoral research which was carried out at tata institute of social sciences mumbai my experiences in the doctoral programme offered me opportunities to learn and grow both professionally and personally this programme would not have been possible without the valuable help and guidance of various people to whom i am immensely grateful i would like to mention some of the people who have contributed to this research directly and indirectly

this collection provides a comprehensive insight into disabled children and youth in nordic countries it seeks to understand the experiences of children from their own perspectives and takes a multidisciplinary approach grounded in the new social studies of childhood and the nordic relational approach to disability

this book is about the meaning of disability in schools the experience of children with disabilities in schools has undergone substantial change over the last twenty years and more with many children who would have once been living in institutions now going to school alongside their peers with this monumental shift and the continuing increased participation of people with disabilities one might wonder what disability means in the age of institutionalisation disability referred to those people who were not

able to actively participate in society as it turns out many of the people who were deemed unable to participate were so only because the society in which they lived had kept them from active participation through institutionalisation in ontario canada where the author lives and works many adults with disabilities continue to live in institutions and are also active in their communities so it is not just the institutions that disable people there are many reasons that people fall into the classification of disabled and for some this classification begins in an institution often in the institution of school this book explores the different beliefs that teachers and parents hold about disability and the types of barriers that cause disability and how these beliefs translate into education practice

drawing on rich empirical work emerging from core conflict regions within the island nation of sri lanka this book illustrates the critical role that women with disabilities play in post armed conflict rebuilding and development this pathbreaking book shows the critical role that women with disabilities play in post armed conflict rebuilding and development through offering a rare yet important insight into the processes of gendered disability advocacy activation within the post conflict environment it provides a unique counter narrative to the powerful images symbols and discourses that too frequently perpetuate disabled women s so called need for paternalistic forms of care rather than being the mere recipients of aid and help the narratives of women with disabilities reveal the generative praxis of social solidarity and cohesion progressed via their nascent collective practices of gendered disability advocacy it will be of interest to academics and students working in the fields of disability studies gender studies post conflict studies peace studies and social work

this book explores the experiences of six women with physical disabilities in china highlighting their education employment relationships family life and social activism it aims to amplify their voices challenge dominant narratives and inspire better support for disabled women globally

one of the greatest challenges facing modern global health is how to include the most marginalized and impoverished people in international efforts to promote social and economic development in disability and international development disability rights are situated within the broader context of global health and the need for much greater inter sector collaboration reports from a broad cross section of low and middle income countries locales as diverse as zimbabwe bolivia kyrgyzstan and papua new guinea move beyond surface discussions of what is working and what shows promise to discuss political and governance contexts the roles of disabled persons in research by outsiders concurrent struggles e g women s or children s rights and instructive inroads made by community activists and national disabled people s organizations the results are provocative and offer new lenses for viewing both the issues and the populations they affect each of the book schapters spotlights a topic as representative of the enormity and immediacy of challenges to inclusive global health including the impact of international human rights law on domestic law and local traditions the effect of failed states on the lives of people with disabilities empowerment and advocacy disability organizations and movements hiv aids interventions with disabled persons assistive technologies in low income countries strategies for improving the lives of children with disabilities cross disciplinary as well as cross cultural disability and international development will attract a wide audience of professionals in rehabilitation social welfare and human rights governmental and non governmental organizations and disabled people s organizations researchers and practitioners it will also be relevant to those working in health and welfare administration health policy international aid and development and human rights in addition graduate students in disability studies public and global health and international development should find this an important guide to the future of these fields

this work critically examines diversity discrimination and inclusion in the english speaking caribbean nations with a specific emphasis on persons with disabilities the chapters include an evaluative analysis on the extant theoretical and empirical literature on persons with disabilities in employment exploring the nature of their disability the role of information technology in gaining and retaining employment and an analysis of the laws and relevant policies which prohibit the discrimination against persons with disabilities in the caribbean region though the enactment of legislation outlawing the discrimination of persons with disabilities is not widespread in the caribbean a few select territories have taken positive steps towards recognition of the need to achieve inclusion of persons with disabilities and accept the diversity of the caribbean populace after exploring the general state of disability and discrimination in the caribbean region the authors analyze workplace accommodations provided to persons with disability particularly as relations to it and assistive devices before focusing on workplace stigmas related to mental health disability and employment law in addition to literature based analyses the book includes qualitative case studies with the goal of providing benchmarks in organizational responses to employees with disabilities further the authors highlight lessons to be learned from other countries in addressing inequality in the workplace for disabled persons with its analysis of employment as well as socio economic and legal issues this interdisciplinary text will serve as a useful resource in not only understanding the organizational challenges faced by persons with disabilities in the region but also the necessary legislation needed to address discriminatory practices on a wider scale
